SPEECH & LANGUAGE DYNAMIC ASSESSMENT

- A hands-on training course for speech & language therapists

Introduction

We are happy to offer our first international course in Speech & Language Dynamic Assessment 21st-22nd of April and 9th of June 2020. The course is organized by Neuroguide.dk. Teacher is Natalie Hasson, author of the book "The Dynamic Assessment of Language Learning", an experienced practitioner in conducting and teaching Dynamic Assessment within the field of Speech & Language.

Within the speech-hearing and linguistic-communicative field, the dynamic approach to assessment has internationally shown great potential as a supplementary assessment to normbased testing. The approach is relevant both to specific and more general issues and also to multilingual children.

Course description

Dynamic Assessment is a complementary or alternate set of assessment and intervention procedures that have been used by psychologists to assess underlying cognitive abilities required for a range of learning and developmental needs. The concepts of Dynamic assessment have more recently been adopted for the assessment of language and communication skills, for which they have relevance in all language contexts, and for a range of clinical groups. Many of these groups are those for whom standardized tests of language are unsuitable. The course will enable participants to use existing dynamic assessments of language, and to adapt tasks to assess children and adults in various aspects of language.

The course will draw on the most up-to-date research and test development within the field of dynamic assessment of language. The course combines theoretical teaching, introduction to the core concepts and practical training in the dynamic approach to assessment, enabling participants to implement dynamic methods in their clinical practice. The methods and tools are relevant in relation to working with individuals with special educational needs, learning disorders, language disorders, linguistic minority backgrounds and hearing impairments.

Learning Objectives and Outcomes

- To introduce participants to the concepts and methods of Dynamic assessments, and how they apply to the assessment of language.
- To enable participants to become familiar with a range of DA methods and understand how they can be applied to assessment of different parts of the language system.
- To enable participants to acquire the skills to interpret findings and develop interventions based on their DA findings in clinical settings.
- To introduce participants to the notion of Mediated Learning and its practical application within dynamic assessment and within interventions by Speech and Language Therapists.
- To develop the ability to use Dynamic Assessment alongside selected standardized tests creating a blended model of assessment in practice.
- To build on skills taught in the initial workshop through discussion, questions and reflections arising from practice, in the second module.

Practical information

Dates

The course is a two-module course. International participants can choose only to attend the first module or attend both modules. The first module will provide you with an understanding Dynamic Assessment and enable you to start integrating dynamic assessment in your assessment practice. Module two is a follow-up practicum module, where we you will have the chance to get further inspiration, methodological guidelines and support to reflect on your practical experiences.

Module 1: 21st-22nd of April 2020 Module 2: 9th of June 2020

Course hours: 21^{th} of April: 9.30am - 4.30pm. 22^{th} of April: 9am - to 4pm. 9^{th} of June: 9.30am - 4.30pm.

A light breakfast will be available every course day from half an hour before the course starts. Detailed schedule will be sent to participants prior to course start.

Course venue

The course will be held in the central part of Odense in a short walking distance from the central station. Adress: Mødecenter (Meeting center) Odense, Buchwaldsgade 48, 5000 Odense C, Denmark.





Course format

The course is an external course (accommodation not included). The course is conducted as a combination of presentations, video analyses, exercises and discussion. Between the two course modules, participants are encouraged to practice the methods presented at the course, and bring questions and reflections to the second module.

Please note: The course is conducted in easily understandable English. Selected parts of the course material will be translated into Danish (as well as supplied in English).

Price

Course price is 3950 DKK (Danish currency) for module 1 and 5900 DKK for both modules, which includes:

- Teaching and teaching materials
- The book "The Dynamic Assessment of Language Learning"
- Breakfast, lunch, tea and coffee during the day

The course price does not include accommodation. In case of cancellation of the course, due to few participants, teacher illness etc. the full course fee will be repaid.

Course content

Module 1:

- What is Dynamic Assessment (DA)
- The Mediational Method
- Cognitive dynamic assessments that have informed thinking about DA for SLT
- DA in assessment of Speech and Language
- Why and How is DA applicable to SLT
- Previous research into DA in SLT
- Practical session using the DA of narrative
- The Dynamic Assessment of Sentence Structure (DASS)
- How other aspects of language can be assessed using DA methods (with reference to known standardized assessments)

Module 2 will focus on participants experiences, practical use, implementation and adaptation of materials. The detailed program for this module will tailored to the group and the needs that arise from participants practicum experience.

Course organizer and teacher



Teacher throughout the course

Natalie Hasson is teacher during the entire course. Natalie has a background in Speech and Language Therapy, as well as clinical linguistics, and has many years of both clinical experience working with children with language disorders and hearing impairments, and of lecturing experience, training Speech and Language Therapy students in language development, developmental language disorders and clinical skills. After training in the intervention methods of IE, Natalie trained in DA, learning the LPAD amongst educational psychologists, before specializing in the

DA of language, and pursuing original PhD research into the Dynamic Assessment of Sentence Structure. Natalie, and colleagues at City University London, have travelled widely throughout the UK, running short courses and seminars about DA of language. Currently Natalie also works as a Registered Intermediary supporting vulnerable child witnesses and victims in the Criminal Justice System.

Course organizer and provider

The course is provided and organized by Neuroguide.dk, psychologist Jens Wilbrandt. Jens Wilbrandt has many years of experience in the special education field and is qualified in an broad area of dynamic assessment and mediated learning methods (LPAD, DAYC, IE, CAP, Bright Start). He is an exponent of a development-oriented educational psychological approach and has many years of experience as a facilitator, lecturer and course teacher in the neuropsychological, and educational psychological field.
